### ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2024

Despite facing challenging political circumstances in Afghanistan, the Afghanistan Badminton Federation has continued to push forward with its programs. In January 2021, operations resumed and continued until August 15, when the country fell under Taliban control, forcing many athletes to flee. As a result, Afghanistan's male and female athletes sought refuge in various countries and joined badminton clubs, participating in local tournaments with impressive results.

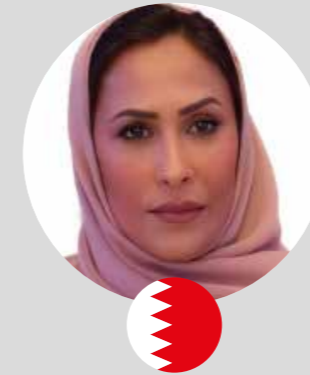
Some of the key achievements and efforts in 2024 include:

- **Expansion of Badminton:** The sport was expanded to provinces. A big total of new players were trained, with 40% of them being female. However, it is important to note that female athletes still face significant restrictions due to the Taliban's rules.
- **National Events:** In 2024, the Federation successfully conducted national events, helping to promote the sport and identify rising talents.
- **Training Camps** were organized to enhance the skills of players across different regions.
- **Support for Female Athletes:** The Federation continues to support female athletes by providing opportunities to train and participate in competitions, particularly in Iran.

Despite the political and social challenges faced by Afghanistan, the Afghanistan Badminton Federation has made significant strides in maintaining the sport's development. We expanded badminton to provinces, training players, including, despite the difficulties posed by the Taliban's restrictions on women.

Additionally, we were able to organize training opportunities for our athletes abroad. In January 2025, our male and female athletes participated in the Fajr Badminton Tournament in Semnan, Iran. Moreover, one of our female athletes had the opportunity to attend the Asia Olympic Workshop in Thailand in November 2024. This represents an essential step in advancing our athletes' exposure to international training and competition, providing them with a platform for future success.

Furthermore, the President served as an administrative delegate with the Afghanistan team at the Paris 2024 Olympic Games, ensuring the team's participation and support during the event. In January 2025, he represented the Asia Badminton Federation at the Iran Fajr Tournament, further strengthening international relations and promoting the sport within the region.

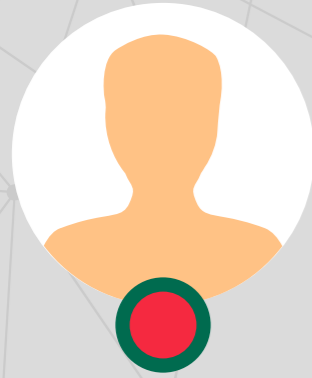

### ACHIEVEMENTS

Bangladesh Badminton Federation (BBF) promote and Develop Badminton across the Nation. The BBF plays a pivotal role in organizing tournaments, coaching programs, training program and ensuring the growth of Badminton in Bangladesh.

BBF organized 38th National Badminton Championship-2023 and Sheikh Kamal 2nd Bangladesh Youth Games (Badminton)-2023. Through organizing training camps we are hunting skilled Badminton Players for future. For the development of technical official we have organized BWF Level-1 Coach Education Course-2023 with the support of Badminton Asia.

Our Players achieved a glorious result in the Badminton Asia South Asia (Under-15 & Under-17) Regional Junior Badminton Championship-2023 tournament in Kathmandu, Nepal. In individual events Under-17 age group our players got Gold Medal in Boy's Singles Event, Gold Medal in Boy's Doubles Event and Bronze Medal in Mixed Doubles Event. Bangladesh Badminton team participated in Badminton Asia Junior Championships-2023 at Yogyakarta, Indonesia; Badminton Asia Championship-2023 at Dubai, United Arab Emirates; Badminton Asia South Asia (under-17 & under-15) Regional Junior Championships-2023 at Kathmandu, Nepal and Yonex Sunrise India Junior International Grand Prix Badminton Championship 2023 at Pune, India. Our three players have participated in Asia Olympic Program Training Camp in Malaysia.

Bangladesh has two BWF certified Umpire and three BA accredited Umpires those who are conducting tournaments including super series in home and abroad. ### ACHIEVEMENTS

#### Players:

Miss. Sapuna Subba had been identified by the Bhutan Badminton Federation for the upcoming Asian Youth Para Games 2021. She was categorized in the short stature (SH6) and participated with the support of the female participation grant sanctioned by the BWF

Miss. Sapuna Subba bagged Bronze Medal in Women's Singles and Mixed Doubles in her category-SH6 (short stature) in Asian Youth Para Games 2021. Thus, she has created history in the development of Para-badminton, Badminton and Paralympics movement in Bhutan. She becomes the first Para athlete to win medal for the Bhutan Paralympic Committee and the Bhutan Badminton Federation.

On Friday, 31st December, 2021, Her Royal Highness Princess Euphelma Choden Wangchuck, Hon'ble President of the Bhutan Paralympics Committee (BPC) awarded cash incentives to Para-Badminton player Ms. Sapuna Subba and coach Dorji. Miss Sapuna Subba brought home two bronze medals from the Asian Youth Para Games (AYPG), thereby becoming the first ever Para athlete to win a medal for Bhutan, at an international competition. She participated in the Women's Singles and Mixed Doubles in Para Badminton SH6 (short stature) category. The AYPG was held from 27th of November to 8th of December, 2021 in the Kingdom of Bahrain.

#### Events:

The U13 Winter Coaching camp was conducted targeting kids under 13 years of age to engage in playing badminton through fun. The camp was organized from December 1-13 followed by a platform to showcase their skills through the U13 shuttle time tournament that was held on 14th and 15th December 2021.

The Secretary General awarded medals to the Coaches of the Federation for their 20 years of dedicated service to the Federation and the Royal Government of Bhutan. Mr. Sherab Gyaltshen received the medal and the command of the His Majesty the King through the Secretary General in person while Mr. Dorji received the Medal and the command through an online platform. Tashi Delek to the Coaches.

Due to the pandemic, we could not conduct much on the technical program except the General Fitness Test Administrators Certification Course from 21st to 225th October 2021

### Development:

The federation conducted para badminton awareness program at Gesarling HSS. Coach Dorji advocated the inclusiveness of badminton sport in a two-day awareness program (July 25th and 26th, 2021). A student of Gesarling HSS with disabilities was given the opportunity to play and learn about badminton.

The Federation welcomed Mr. Ngawang Loday, on August 6, 2021 as an Honorary Treasurer after recognizing his genuine interest in assisting the federation with advisory roles in managing financial aspects of the federation in compliance with the Bhutan Financial Rules and Regulations (FRR). Mr. Ngawang graduated with Bachelor's Degree in Commerce specializing in Finance from Gaeddu College of Business Studies, Royal University of Bhutan. Currently, he works as Senior Audit Associate at the Rinzing Financial Private Limited, Thimphu

Mr. Dorji Dukpa is a BWF Level 1 certified coach at Haa, and he is a passionate badminton enthusiast. He has been actively promoting badminton at Chundu Armed Forces Public School in Haa since his certification in 2019. He continuously promotes badminton during his leisure hours. On September 3rd, 2021, he engaged school children in a fundamental coaching session.

Mr. Tshering Dorji, an Instructor at the Technical Training Institute in Rangjung, Trashigang, established a club with ten female members on 4th September 2021. He wants to use badminton to empower women, therefore on weekends he promotes the sport within female teenagers through foundational coaching.

The Federation conducted a Shuttle Time Teachers' course on the 6th and 7th of November 2021 and trained students from 8th to 14th November at Chundu Armed Forces Public School (CAFPS), at Haa Dzongkhag. 20 teachers and 21 students benefited from the course. The National Coach, Mr. Sherab Gyaltshen conducted the course.

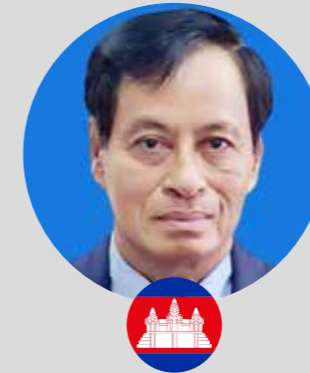

### ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2024

In 2024, the Chinese National Badminton Team won 94 champions in International tournaments (including 2 Gold medals in Paris Olympic Games). Chinese Badminton Association successfully hosted T&U Cups, which lightened the passion and affection to our beloved sport. In addition, Chinese Badminton Association also held other 8 international tournaments successfully. Such high-quality tournament delivery benefited every aspect of badminton community. The tournament income surpassed 130 million RMB.

Chinese Badminton Association set a series of standards at the national rankings, the regulation of the badminton infrastructures, badminton capacity recognition and so forth. The standardization is of vital importance to

badminton as it emerges the development of the sport into a sustainable, long-term, profitable and mass-originated method in China.

The cultivation and officiating of technical officials has long been an essential assignment. In 2024, Chinese Badminton Association organized 3 national training courses for approximate 200 Chinese umpires. The total officiating number in 2024 reached 1196 person-times involving 48 events.

For the market expansion, Chinese Badminton Association has worked on the in-depth implementation of the integration of sports and education by cooperating deeply with sports associations at campuses, encouraging and organizing the students players to join the badminton games and activities of all levels. The national and regional badminton events covered the participants of badminton from all the ages and groups.

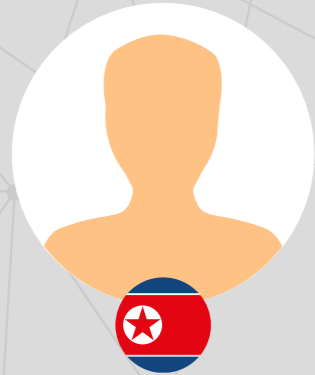

2024 marks the 90th anniversary of the establishment of the BAHKC. Over the years, BAHKC has worked hard together, witnessing the vigorous development of badminton. Today, badminton has become one of the most popular sports in Hong Kong. The Hong Kong, China athletes have demonstrated extraordinary competitiveness on the international stage. The BAHKC has successfully hosted various international badminton events.

In 2024, BAHKC hosted the LI-NING Hong Kong Open Badminton Championships 2024 part of the HSBC BWF World Tour Super 500, attracted 238 world-class players from 20 countries and regions. During

the 6-day event, a record-breaking 37,822 spectators attended the matches. Total of 18,800 teenagers benefit from the Community Partnership Programme, the legacy event of LI-NING Hong Kong Open.

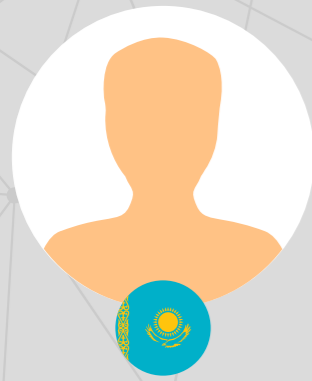

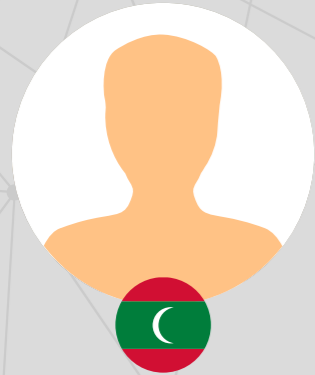

Aaron Chia and Soh Wooi Yik defended their Tokyo 2020 Olympic bronze, reaffirming their status. Pearly Tan and Thinaah Muralitharan made history as the first Malaysian women's doubles pair to reach the Paris 2024 Olympic semifinals. Chen Tang Jie and Toh Ee Wei had a breakthrough year, qualifying for the Olympics and topping their group with a win over China's second pair.

Malaysia claimed bronze at the Thomas Cup, their first medal in the tournament since 2016, despite a 1-3 semifinal loss to hosts China. They also secured silver at the Badminton Asia Team Championships after a 0-3 defeat to China.

In the junior ranks, Aaron Tai-Kang Khai Xing ended Malaysia's 13-year boys' doubles title drought by winning gold at the 2024 World Junior Championships, after claiming silver at the Asia Junior Championships. The junior team also defended their Suhandinata Cup bronze.

Legs 1, 2, and 3, along with the Grand Finale, attracted a substantial turnout, with more than 235 registrations across various age categories, including Under 9, 11, 13, 15, 17 and 19. This robust participation reflects the

growing interest and enthusiasm within the junior badminton community.

### International Exposure and Achievements:

QBA marked its first international participation by sending a team of talented players to compete in Austria, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, and Slovakia in May & October 2024. This experience not only provided valuable exposure to our players but also contributed to the elevation of Qatar's standing in the international badminton community.

### Summer and Winter Camp Training:

The organization of intensive training camps was a key focus in 2024. Our junior players underwent two weeks of rigorous training in Malaysia during the summer camp and a focused 2 weeks in Indonesia for the winter camp. These camps not only enhanced the skills of our players but also fostered camaraderie and team spirit.

### West Asia Representation:

Qatar proudly fielded a team of 5 players at the West Asia held in Oman, further emphasizing our commitment to regional sporting events and promoting badminton excellence on the continental stage. Our Qatar team won the bronze Medal in the Team competition Under 17.

The achievements and initiatives outlined in this report signify a year of growth, collaboration, and success for the Qatar Badminton Federation. Looking ahead, we remain dedicated to fostering talent, promoting the sport at all levels, and achieving even greater milestones in the coming years.

The Singapore Badminton Association (SBA) has marked 2024 as a year of remarkable achievements, strengthening its presence on the global badminton stage. One of the key highlights was the successful hosting of the **BWF Super-750 Singapore Badminton Open**, which attracted world-class players and demonstrated Singapore's prowess in organizing major international sporting events. With exceptional efficiency and robust security measures, SBA set a benchmark for event management, further elevating Singapore's reputation as a premier destination for global sports. Additionally, SBA introduced a groundbreaking **post-career planning and gratuity program** for national players, recognizing their dedication and sacrifices. This initiative provided financial support, career transition programs, and educational resources, with the first batch of beneficiaries awarded in 2024—a testament to SBA's commitment to athlete welfare.

In 2024, Singaporean badminton players made remarkable strides on the global stage. Loh Kean Yew reached the quarter-finals at the Paris Olympics, marking the first time in two decades that a

Singaporean singles player reached this stage at the Olympics. He also secured the Madrid Spain Masters title, reaffirming his status as a top contender. Yeo Jia Min advanced to the Olympic Round of 16, marking a historic achievement for Singaporean women's singles. Mixed doubles duo Terry Hee and Jessica Tan became the first local-born pair to qualify for the Olympics, while Jason Teh had a strong year with his four finals appearances in Men's singles. These milestones reflect Singapore's growing presence in international badminton and the nation's commitment to nurturing top-tier talent.

Another significant milestone was the redevelopment of the **historic Singapore Badminton Stadium at Guillemard Road**, which reopened as a modern facility dedicated to community use. Originally established in 1952, the stadium holds a rich legacy in Singapore's sporting and cultural history, having hosted iconic events like the Thomas Cup Championships and concerts by global stars. Its transformation not only preserves its historical significance but also revitalizes it as a hub for badminton development and community engagement. These achievements underscore SBA's dedication to excellence in event organization, athlete development, and heritage preservation, shaping a bright future for badminton in Singapore.

### ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2024

SLB had an exceptional year in 2024, marked by increased activities, tournaments, and player development programs. This year saw significant progress in coaching, player development, regional growth, and international participation.

**Tournaments and Events** - SLB organized 12 Level 1 and 2 Level 2 ranking tournaments, attracting an average of 1,000 entries per event. These tournaments were held with high standards, including synthetic courts and service measurement devices, and featured Rs. 750,000 in prize money. SLB also hosted Zonal Tournaments and Junior Nationals, which saw 8,000 entries from across Sri Lanka.

**Coaching and Development Programs** - SLB's coaching programs, including SLB Level 1/2 and BWF Level 1/2, saw participation from 162 and 17 coaches, respectively. A total of 124 coaches received coaching licenses in 2024. The High-Performance Coaching Program trained 19 elite coaches, and basic courses were held in several outstation cities. A new software system was introduced to streamline tournament operations and ranking management.

**National Pool and Training** - SLB provided accommodation and training facilities for 15 full-time national pool players, supported by an overseas coach and sparring players. SLB also created a backup pool to nurture emerging talent.

**Regional Development** - The Regional Development Committee (RDC) trained Under 13 and Under-15 players in 25 districts, aiming for 100% nationwide coverage by 2025. A Novices Tournament with 1,584 entries was held, and RDC plans an All-Island Tournament in 2025.

**Air Badminton and Shuttle Time Programs** - SLB introduced Air Badminton and Shuttle Time programs

in 50 schools, training 200 teachers. These programs engage students, particularly in areas without indoor facilities, and aim to introduce badminton to 250 new schools by 2025.

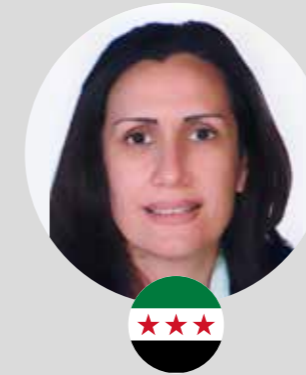
**International Tournaments** - After nearly 9 years, SLB hosted two international tournaments, attracting over 300 international and 100 local players. Sri Lanka participated in 42 international events in 2024, with 5 players breaking into the top 200 world rankings. One player qualified directly for the Paris Olympics.

**Administrative and Committee Activities** - SLB's administrative committees, including Finance, Legal, and Media, played a vital role in ensuring efficient operations throughout the year.

**Women's Empowerment** - SLB achieved BWF's target of 35% gender balance in badminton administration by the end of 2024, covering areas like General Council, Technical Officials, Match Controllers, Coaches, and Office Management.

**Finance Overview** - SLB recorded a turnover of LKR 159 million, with operational costs of LKR 160 million. SLB is primarily supported by sponsorships, which enable the organization to maintain high standards.

**Conclusion** - 2024 was a transformative year for SLB, with significant achievements in tournaments, player development, coaching, and international exposure. Moving forward, SLB is focused on expanding opportunities for players and coaches, further developing badminton in Sri Lanka, and setting new benchmarks for the sport.

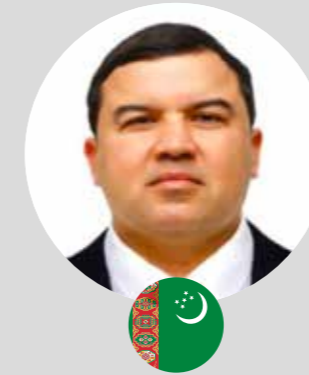

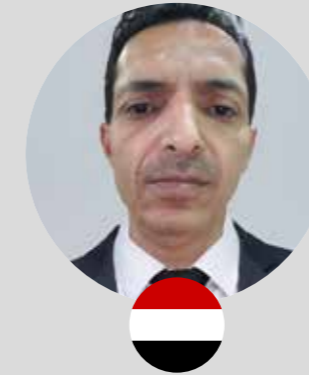

#### ACHIEVEMENTS IN 2024

In 2024, the Oman Racket Sports Committee (ORSC) made remarkable strides in promoting badminton nationwide. A major highlight was hosting the Badminton Asia West Asia Junior Championship in October at the Sultan Qaboos Sports Complex in Muscat, drawing participation from eight West Asian countries and fostering regional sportsmanship. Alongside this, ORSC convened the Badminton Asia West Asia Leaders Meeting, bringing together representatives from 11 countries to discuss strategic growth for the sport. Additionally, ORSC prioritized officiating excellence by conducting the Regional Umpires Training Course 2024 (West Asia), ensuring high refereeing standards. In May, ORSC launched Oman's first-ever sports club league, featuring 12 clubs in a competitive format, followed by the inaugural Junior Championship for sports clubs in July, providing young athletes with valuable exposure.

To further develop grassroots talent, summer training centres were established across six governorates, while three intensive training camps led to the formation of Oman's first junior national team in the under-15 and under-17 categories. Another significant achievement was the Oman Grand Prix Badminton Tournament Season 3, held at AMM Sports Arena in collaboration with ORSC, providing a professional stage for national talent and reinforcing unity and sportsmanship. These initiatives have not only propelled the sport's growth locally but have also positioned Omani players for participation on the international stage. ORSC's efforts in 2024 have built a strong foundation for the future of badminton in Oman, ensuring continued progress and inspiring upcoming generations of athletes.

- Through the **Human Resource Development Fund (HRDF)** programmes, Badminton Asia has facilitated training sessions for Finance and Technical Officials Committee personnel to enhance self-improvement and office development.

## 2 MOU COLLABORATION WITH MEMBER ASSOCIATION

- In April 2024, **Badminton Asia** signed an MOU with **the Badminton Association of Hong Kong, China Limited** to strengthen cooperation in badminton development.
- The collaboration focuses on **training, coaching development, exchange programmes, and sports science initiatives** to support mutual growth and excellence.

## 3 MEMBERSHIP UPDATE

Badminton Asia has achieved full membership status with **43 Member Associations** and **2 Affiliate Members**, in line with the Olympic Council of Asia (OCA) standard.

## 4 NEW MEDIA PARTNER

Reddentes Sports Pte. Ltd (Singapore) has been appointed as the Media Rights Partner for the 2025–2027 cycle. Further details can be found in Marketing Committee Report.

## 5 NOTICES OF TERMINATION

The following agreements were terminated due to **non-payment of contractual fees and failure to fulfil key obligations:**

- **Media Rights Agreement with SDG Marketing Korea Co. Ltd.** – Terminated 30 August 2024
- **Cosmetic Sales & Distribution License Agreement with SDG Marketing Korea Co. Ltd.** – Terminated 22 August 2024
- **Merchandising Sales License Agreement with Joinsportainment Korea Co. Ltd.** – Terminated 22 August 2024

## 6 BWF CC WORKSHOP 2024

- Key topics discussed included member Development and Programmes, Events and Technical Officials, growth in Para Badminton and AirBadminton, as well as Marketing and Communications.

## 8 APPLICATION FOR INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATION (IO)

- On 28th May 2024, Badminton Asia presented its proposal to obtain International Organization (IO) status. Ministries involved in the meeting:
  - Ministry of Youth and Sports (KBS);
  - Ministry of Finance Malaysia (MOF) and;
  - Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- Key feedback from the ministries
  - Badminton Asia must provide a long-term development plan in Malaysia.
  - Clarification is needed on the scope of privileges and immunities sought.
  - High-ranking foreign officers must reside in Malaysia.
- Recommendations:
  - The MOF suggested Badminton Asia should first apply for income tax exemption for foreign workers.
  - The Ministry of Foreign Affairs emphasised the importance of fulfilling core requirements before reapplying for full IO status.
- Badminton Asia will proceed with MOF's recommendation and revisit the IO status application once all requirements are met.

## 9 SHOW CAUSE & DISCIPLINARY ACTION (MEDIA RIGHTS & HOSTING AGREEMENT CONFLICT)

- Show Cause Notices were issued to the **former President and Secretariat General of Badminton Asia** regarding their roles in the **Beyond Boundaries Sports Management (BB)** Hosting Agreement and its conflict with the **Media Rights Agreement (IMG)**.
- Investigations revealed negligence in reviewing the agreements, lack of committee involvement, and conflicts in media rights allocations, which resulted in overlapping contracts and governance failures.
- As part of BA's commitment to accountability and governance, the EXCO Members unanimously agreed to issue a formal warning letter to both individuals under Article 11.2(a) of the Badminton Asia Constitution. The warning letters were officially issued on 21 November 2024 as a formal reprimand.

## 10 STRATEGIC PLAN 2025–2028

- The Badminton Asia Strategic Plan 2025–2028 is a roadmap designed to set priorities, align resources, and strengthen operations for long-term growth.
- The plan follows the theme “United and Connected / One Asia, One Spirit” and aligns with the Olympic cycle to ensure structured growth.
- It is structured around:
  - **Three Key Priority Areas (KPAs):**
    - i. Development: Focus on Member Associations’ (MAs) capacity building, player development, coaching education, regional programmes, and equipment support.
    - ii. Events: Strengthening major events, junior tournaments, and technical officials’ training.
    - iii. New Growth Areas: Expansion of AirBadminton, Para Badminton, Special Olympics, gender equity, and the introduction of a Senior League.
  - **Four Key Functional Areas (KFAs):**
    - i. Governance & Administration: Emphasising good governance, transparency, human resource development, and IT infrastructure.
    - ii. Finance: Strengthening financial protocols, budgeting, audits, and financial sustainability.
    - iii. Marketing & Communication: Enhancing branding, sponsorship, digital engagement, and member association outreach.
    - iv. Humanitarian Initiatives: Supporting education, community engagement, health and well-being, and gender equality initiatives.
- The strategy aims to increase participation, improve event organisation, expand governance frameworks, and enhance financial stability, ensuring the long-term success of badminton in Asia.





**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

**1. GENERAL INFORMATION**

The principal activities of the Confederation are those of promoting, managing and developing the badminton sport in Asia in principles of specificity and universality.

The Confederation is registered in Malaysia under the Societies Act, 1966.

The financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM"), which is also the functional currency of the Confederation.

**2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

**2.1 Basis of preparation**

The financial statements of the Confederation have been prepared in accordance with the Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards ("MFRSs"), International Financial Reporting Standards and the requirements of the Societies Act, 1966 in Malaysia.

The financial statements of the Confederation have been prepared under the historical cost basis, other than as disclosed in the significant accounting policies in Note 2.3 to the financial statements.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with MFRSs requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of the revenue and expenses during the reported period. It also requires Management Committee to exercise their judgement in the process of applying the Confederation's accounting policies. Although these estimates and judgement are based on the Management Committee's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results may differ.

The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements are disclosed in Note 2.4 to the financial statements.

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the financial statements: -

**(a) Plant and Equipment and Depreciation**

All plant and equipment are initially stated at cost. After recognition as an asset, items of plant and equipment are carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. The policy for the recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with Note 2.3(f) to the financial statements.

Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. When significant parts of an item of plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items of plant and equipment.

The cost of replacing part of an item of plant and equipment is included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the part will flow to the Confederation and its cost can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of the replaced part is derecognised. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to the profit or loss as incurred.

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line method so as to write off the depreciable amount of the following assets over their estimated useful lives, as follows:

Depreciation of an asset begins when it is ready for its intended use.

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation are reviewed, and adjusted as appropriate, at the end of each reporting period. The effects of any revisions of the residual value and useful lives are included in the profit or loss for the financial year in which the changes arise.

An item of plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset is included in the profit or loss in the financial year the asset is derecognised.

**Recognition and initial measurement**

Financial instruments are recognised in the statements of financial position when, and only when, the Confederation becomes a party to the contract provisions of the financial instrument.

A financial instrument is recognised initially, at its fair value, plus, in the case of a financial instrument not at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of the financial instrument.

An embedded derivative is recognised separately from the host contract and accounted for as a derivative if, and only if, it is not closely related to the economic characteristics and risks of the host contract and the host contract is not categorised at fair value through profit or loss. The host contract, in the event an embedded derivative is recognised separately, is accounted for in accordance with policy applicable to the nature of the host contract.

**Financial instrument categories and subsequent measurement**

**Financial assets**

The categories of financial assets are determined on initial recognition and are not reclassified subsequent to their initial recognition unless the Company changes its business model for managing financial assets in which case all affected financial assets are reclassified on the first day of the first reporting period following the change of the business model.

**(i) Amortised cost**

Amortised cost category comprises financial assets that are held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets to collect contractual cash flows and its contractual terms give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding. The financial assets are not designated as fair value through profit or loss. Subsequent to initial recognition, these financial assets are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. The amortised cost is reduced by impairment losses. Interest income, foreign exchange gains and losses and impairment are recognised in profit or loss. Any gain or loss on derecognition is recognised in profit or loss.

Interest income is recognised by applying effective interest rate to the gross carrying amount except for credit impaired financial assets as disclosed in Note 2.3(f) to the financial statements, where the effective interest rate is applied to the amortised cost.

**(ii) Fair value through other comprehensive income**

**(a) Debt investments**

Fair value through other comprehensive income category comprises debt investment where it is held within a business model whose objective is achieved by both collecting contractual cash flows and selling the debt investment, and its contractual terms give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding. The debt investment is not designated as at fair value through profit or loss. Interest income calculated using the effective interest method, foreign exchange gains and losses and impairment are recognised in profit or loss. Other net gains and losses are recognised in other comprehensive income. On derecognition, gains and losses accumulated in other comprehensive income are reclassified to profit or loss.

Interest income is recognised by applying effective interest rate to the gross carrying amount except for credit impaired financial assets, where the effective interest rate is applied to the amortised cost.

**(b) Equity investments**

This category comprises investment in equity that is not held for trading, and the Confederation irrevocably elect to present subsequent changes in the investment's fair value in other comprehensive income. This election is made on an investment-by-investment basis. Dividends are recognised as income in profit or loss unless the dividend clearly represents a recovery of part of the cost of investment. Other net gains and losses are recognised in other comprehensive income. On derecognition, gains and losses accumulated in other comprehensive income are not reclassified to profit or loss.

**(iii) Fair value through profit or loss**

All financial assets not measured at amortised cost or fair value through other comprehensive income as described above are measured at fair value through profit or loss. This includes derivative financial assets (except for a derivative that is a designated and effective hedging instrument). On initial recognition, the Confederation may irrevocably designate a financial asset that otherwise meets the requirements to be measured at amortised cost or at fair value through other comprehensive income as at fair value through profit or loss if doing so eliminates or significantly reduces an accounting mismatch that would otherwise arise.

Financial assets categorised as fair value through profit or loss are subsequently measured at their fair value. Net gains or losses, including any interest or dividend income, are recognised in the profit or loss.

**Financial assets (Continued)**

All financial assets, except for those measured at fair value through profit or loss and equity investments measured at fair value through other comprehensive income, are subject to impairment assessment.

**Financial liabilities**

The categories of financial liabilities at initial recognition are as follows:-

**(i) Financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss**

Fair value through profit or loss category comprises financial liabilities that are derivatives (except for a derivative that is a financial guarantee contract or a designated and effective hedging instrument), contingent consideration in a business combination and financial liabilities that are specifically designated into this category upon initial recognition.

On initial recognition, the Confederation may irrevocably designate a financial liability that otherwise meets the requirements to be measured at amortised cost as at fair value through profit or loss:-

- (a) if doing so eliminates or significantly reduces an accounting mismatch that would otherwise arise;
- (b) a group of financial liabilities or assets and financial liabilities is managed and its performance is evaluated on a fair value basis, in accordance with a documented risk management or investment strategy, and information about the group is provided internally on that basis to the Confederation's key management personnel; or
- (c) if a contract contains one or more embedded derivatives and the host is not a financial asset in the scope of MFRS 9, where the embedded derivative significantly modifies the cash flows and separation is not prohibited.

Financial liabilities categorised as fair value through profit or loss are subsequently measured at their fair value with gains or losses, including any interest expense are recognised in the profit or loss.

For financial liabilities where it is designated as fair value through profit or loss upon initial recognition, the Confederation recognise the amount of change in fair value of the financial liability that is attributable to change in credit risk in the other comprehensive income and remaining amount of the change in fair value in the profit or loss, unless the treatment of the effects of changes in the liability's credit risk would create or enlarge an accounting mismatch.

**(ii) Amortised cost**

Other financial liabilities not categorised as fair value through profit or loss are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Interest expense and foreign exchange gains and losses are recognised in the profit or loss. Any gains or losses on derecognition are also recognised in the profit or loss.

**Financial guarantee contracts**

A financial guarantee contract is a contract that requires the issuer to make specified payments to reimburse the holder for a loss it incurs because a specified debtor fails to make payment when due in accordance with the original or modified terms of a debt instrument.

Financial guarantees issued are initially measured at fair value. Subsequently measured at higher of:-

- the amount of the loss allowance; and
- the amount initially recognised less, when appropriate, the cumulative amount of income recognised in accordance to the principles of MFRS 15, Revenue from Contracts with Customers.

Liabilities arising from financial guarantees are presented together with other provisions.

**Regular way purchase or sale of financial assets**

Settlement date accounting refers to:-

- (i) the recognition of an asset to be received and the liability to pay for it on the trade date, and
- (ii) derecognition of an asset that is sold, recognition of any gain or loss on disposal and the recognition of a receivable from the buyer for payment on the trade date.

Any change in the fair value of the asset to be received during the period between the trade date and the settlement date is accounted in the same way as it accounts for the acquired asset.

Generally, the Confederation applies settlement date accounting unless otherwise stated for the specific class of asset.

**Derecognition**

A financial asset or part of it is derecognised when, and only when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire or transferred, or control of the asset is not retained or substantially all of the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset are transferred to another party. On derecognition of a financial asset, the difference between the carrying amount of the financial asset and the sum of consideration received (including any new asset obtained less any new liability assumed) is recognised in profit or loss.

A financial liability or a part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires. A financial liability is also derecognised when its terms are modified and the cash flows of the modified liability are substantially different, in which case, a new financial liability based on modified terms is recognised at fair value. On derecognition of a financial liability, the difference between the carrying amount of the financial liability extinguished or transferred to another party and the consideration paid, including any non-cash assets transferred or liabilities assumed, is recognised in profit or loss.

**Offsetting**

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount presented in the statements of financial position when, and only when, the Confederation currently has a legally enforceable right to set off the amounts and it intends either to settle them on a net basis or to realise the asset and liability simultaneously.

**(c) Provision for Liabilities**

Provision for liabilities are recognised when the Confederation has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of economic resources will be required to settle the obligation and the amount of the obligation can be estimated reliably.

Provisions are reviewed at the end of each reporting period and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate. If it is no longer probable that an outflow of economic resources will be required to settle the obligation, the provision is reversed. If the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using a current pre-tax rate that reflects, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. When discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognised as a finance cost.

**Recognition and initial measurement**

**As a lessee**

The Confederation recognises a right-of-use asset and a lease liability at the lease commencement date. The right-of-use is initially measured at cost, which comprises the initial amount of the lease liability adjusted for any lease payments made at or before the commencement date, plus any initial direct costs incurred and an estimate of costs to dismantle and remove the underlying asset or to restore the underlying asset or the site on which it is located, less any incentives received.

The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the lease payments that are not paid at the commencement date, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease or, if that rate cannot be readily determined, the Confederation's fixed deposit's rate. Generally, the Confederation uses its fixed deposits rate as the discount rate.

Lease payments included in the measurement of the lease liability comprise the following:

- fixed payments (including in-substance fixed payments) less any incentives receivable;
- variable lease payments that depend on an index or a rate, initially measured using the index or rate as at the commencement date;
- amounts expected to be payable under a residual value guarantee;
- the exercise price under a purchase option that the Confederation is reasonably certain to exercise; and
- penalties for early termination of a lease unless the Confederation is reasonably certain not to terminate early.

The Confederation exclude variable lease payments that linked to future performance or usage of the underlying asset form the lease liability. Instead, these payments are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which the performance or use occurs.

The Confederation has elected not to recognise right-of-use and lease liabilities for short-term leases that have a lease term of 12 months or less and leases of low-value assets. The Confederation recognises the lease payments associated with these leases as an expense in profit or loss on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

**As a lessor**

When the Confederation acts as a lessor, it determines at lease commencement whether each lease is a finance lease or an operating lease.

**As a lessor**

To classify each lease, the Confederation makes an overall assessment of whether the lease transfers to the lessee substantially all of the risks and rewards of ownership incidental to ownership of the underlying asset. If this is the case, then the lease is a finance lease; if not, then it is an operating lease. As part of this assessment, the Confederation considers certain indicators such as whether the lease is for the major part of the economic life of the asset.

When the Confederation is an intermediate lessor, it accounts for its interests in the head lease and the sub-lease separately. It assesses the lease classification of a sub-lease with reference to the right-of-use asset arising from the head lease, not with reference to the underlying asset. If a head lease is a short-term lease to which the Confederation applies the exemption described above, then it classifies the sub-lease as an operating lease.

If an arrangement contains lease and non-lease components, the Confederation applies MFRS 15 to allocate the consideration in the contract.

**Subsequent measurement**

**As a lessee**

The right-of-use asset is subsequently depreciated using the straight-line basis from the commencement date to the earlier of the end of the useful life of the right-of-use asset or the end of the lease term as follows:-

In addition, the right-of-use asset is periodically reduced by impairment losses, if any, and adjusted for certain remeasurements of the lease liability.

The lease liability is measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. It is remeasured when there is a change in future lease payments arising from a change in an index or rate, or if there is a change in the Confederation estimate of the amount expected to be payable under a residual value guarantee, or if the Confederation changes its assessment of whether it will exercise a purchase, extension or termination option.

When the lease liability is remeasured, a corresponding adjustment is made to the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset, or is recorded in profit or loss if the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset has been reduced to zero.

**As a lessor**

The Confederation recognises lease payments received under operating leases as income on a straight-line basis over the lease term as part of "revenue".

**(e) Foreign Currency Translation**

**(i) Foreign Currency**

The functional currency of the Confederation is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Confederation operates. Ringgit Malaysia ("RM") is the functional currency.

The financial statements of the Confederation are presented in US Dollar which is the presentation currency.

**(ii) Transactions in Foreign Currencies**

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into functional currency at rates of exchange ruling at the time of transactions and where settlement had not taken place by 31 December 2021 at the approximate rates ruling as at that date. All gains and losses on exchange are included in the income and expenditure statement.

**(iii) Translation of Foreign Currency Financial Statements**

Foreign assets and liabilities are translated into US Dollar at exchange rates ruling at the date of statement of financial position. Income and expenditure statement items are translated at the average rate of exchange for the financial year. The translation differences arising there from are recorded as movements in translation reserve.

The principal exchange rates (dominated in units of US Dollar per unit of foreign currency) used in translating foreign currency are as follows: -

**(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents**

For the purpose of the statements of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents comprise of cash in hand, bank balances, demand deposits and other short term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value. Cash and cash equivalents are stated at net of bank overdrafts and deposits pledged to the financial institution.

The Confederation assesses at the end of each reporting period whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset is impaired.

**(i) Impairment of Financial Assets**

**Other receivables**

To determine whether there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on financial assets have been occurred, the Confederation considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant delay in payments. For certain categories of financial assets, such as other receivables, assets that are assessed not to be impaired individually are subsequently assessed for impairment on a collective basis based on similar characteristics. Objective evidence of impairment for a portfolio of receivables could include the Confederation's past experience of collecting payments, an increased in the number of delayed payments in the portfolio past the average credit period and the observable changes in national or local economic conditions that correlate with default on receivables.

If any such evidence exists, the amount of impairment loss is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate. The impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss.

The carrying amount of the financial asset is reduced by the impairment loss directly for all financial assets with the exception of other receivables, where the carrying amount is reduced through the use of an allowance account. When the other receivable becomes uncollectible, it is written off against the allowance account.

If in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised, the previously recognised impairment loss is reversed to the extent that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed its amortised cost at the reversal date. The amount of reversal is recognised in profit or loss.

**Unquoted equity securities carried at cost**

If there is objective evidence (such as significant adverse changes in the business environment where the issuer operates, probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the issuer) that an impairment loss on financial assets carried at cost had been incurred, the amount of the loss is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows discounted at the current market rate of return for a similar financial asset. Such impairment losses are not reversed in subsequent periods.

**(ii) Impairment of Non-financial Assets**

The Confederation assesses at the end of each reporting period whether there is an indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, or when an annual impairment assessment for an asset is required, the Confederation makes an estimate of the asset's recoverable amount.

An asset's recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs to sell and its value in use. For the purpose of assessing impairment, assets are grouped at the lowest levels for which there are separately identifiable cash flows (cash-generating units ("CGU")).

In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows expected to be generated by the asset are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset. Where the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount, the asset is written down to its recoverable amount. Impairment losses recognised in respect of a CGU or groups of CGUs are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to those units or groups of units and then, to reduce the carrying amount of the other assets in the unit or groups of units on a pro-rata basis.

Impairment losses are recognised in profit or loss except for assets that are previously revalued where the revaluation was taken to other comprehensive income. In this case, the impairment is also recognised in other comprehensive income up to the amount of any previous revaluation.

An assessment is made at the end of each reporting period as to whether there is any indication that previously recognised impairment losses may no longer exist or may have decreased. A previously recognised impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the asset's recoverable amount since the last impairment loss was recognised. If that is the case, the carrying amount of the asset is increased to its recoverable amount. That increase cannot exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation, had no impairment loss been recognised previously. Such reversal is recognised in profit or loss unless the asset is measured at revalued amount, in which case the reversal is treated as a revaluation increase. Impairment loss on goodwill is not reversed in a subsequent period.

**2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)**

**2.3 Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)**

**(h) Government grant**

Government grants that do not impose specified future performance conditions are measured at the fair value of the assets received or receivable and recognised in income when the grant proceeds are receivable.

Government grants that impose specified future performance conditions are recognised at their fair value in income only when the performance conditions are met.

Government grants received before the revenue recognition criteria are satisfied are recognised as a liability.

**(i) Income recognition**

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of any discounts, rebates, returns and taxes collected on behalf of government. Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transactions will flow to the Confederation.

**(j) Employee Benefits**

**(i) Short Term Employee Benefits**

Wages, salaries, social security contribution, bonuses and non-monetary benefits are accrued in the period in which the associated services are rendered by the employees. Short term accumulating compensated absences such as paid annual leave is recognised when services rendered by the employees that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences. Short term non-accumulating compensated absences such as sick leave is recognised when the absences occur.

**(ii) Post-employment Benefits**

The Confederation contributes to the Employees' Provident Fund, the national defined contribution plan. The contributions are charged to the profit or loss in the period to which the related service is performed. Once the contributions have been paid, the Confederation has no further payment obligations.

**(k) Income Tax**

The tax expense in the profit or loss represents the aggregate amount of current tax and deferred tax. Current tax and deferred tax are recognised in profit or loss except to the extent that they relate to a business combination or items recognised directly in equity or other comprehensive income.

Current tax expense is the expected tax payable or receivable in respect of the taxable profit or loss for the financial year and is measured using the tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

**(k) Income Tax (Continued)**

Deferred tax is recognised using the liability method, providing for temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the statement of financial position and their tax bases. Deferred tax is not recognised for the following temporary differences: the initial recognition of goodwill, the initial recognition of assets or liabilities in a transaction that is not a business combination and that affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply to the temporary differences when they reverse, based on the laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if there is a legally enforceable right to offset current tax liabilities and assets, and they relate to income taxes levied by the same tax authority on the same taxable entity, or on different tax entities, but they intend to settle current tax liabilities and assets on a net basis or their tax assets and liabilities will be realised simultaneously.

A deferred tax asset is recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

A tax incentive that is not a tax base of an asset is recognised as a reduction of tax expense in profit or loss as and when it is granted and claimed. Any unutilised portion of the tax incentive is recognised as a deferred tax asset to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the unutilised tax incentive can be utilised.

**2.4 Significant Accounting Estimates and Judgements**

The preparation of the Confederation's financial statements requires Management Committee to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities at the end of the reporting period. However, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that could require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the asset or liability affected in the future.

**(a) Judgements Made in Applying Accounting Policies**

There are no critical judgements made by the Management Committee in the application of accounting policies of the Confederation that has a significant effect on the financial statements.

**(b) Key Sources of Estimation Uncertainty**

The key assumption concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the end of the reporting period that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are as stated below: -

**(i) Useful Lives of Plant and Equipment**

The Confederation estimates the useful lives of plant and equipment based on the period over which the assets are expected to be available for use. The estimated useful lives of plant and equipment are reviewed periodically and are updated if expectations differ from previous estimates due to physical wear and tear, technical or commercial obsolescence and legal or other limits on the use of the relevant assets.

In addition, the estimation of the useful lives of plant and equipment are based on internal technical evaluation and experience with similar assets. It is possible, however, that future results of operations could be materially affected by changes in the estimates brought about by changes in factors mentioned above. The amounts and timing of recorded expenses for any period would be affected by changes in these factors and circumstances. A reduction in the estimated useful lives of the plant and equipment would increase the recorded expenses and decrease the non-current assets.

**(ii) Impairment of Plant and Equipment**

The Confederation assesses impairment of assets whenever the events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of an asset may not be recoverable i.e. the carrying amount of the asset is more than the recoverable amount.

Recoverable amount is measured at the higher of the fair value less cost to sell for that asset and its value-in-use. The value-in-use is the net present value of the projected future cash flow derived from that asset discounted at an appropriate discount rate. Projected future cash flows are based on the Confederation's estimates calculated based on historical, sector and industry trends, general market and economic conditions, changes in technology and other available information.

As at end of reporting period, the Management Committee of the Confederation are of the opinion that there is no impact resulting from the impairment review by the management.

**(iii) Impairment of Loans and Receivables**

The Confederation assesses at the end of each reporting period whether there is any objective evidence that a financial asset is impaired. To determine whether there is objective evidence of impairment, the Confederation considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the debtor and default or significant delay in payments.

Where there is objective evidence of impairment, the amount and timing of future cash flows are estimated based on historical loss experience for assets with similar credit risk characteristics. The carrying amount of the Confederation's loans and receivables at the end of the reporting period is disclosed in Note 5 to the financial statements.

**(iv) Income Taxes**

Significant judgement is required in determining the capital allowances and deductibility of certain expenses during the estimation of the provision for income taxes. There are many transactions and calculations for which the ultimate tax determination is uncertain during the ordinary course of business. Where the final tax outcome of these matters is different from the amounts that were initially recorded, such differences will impact the income tax and deferred income tax provisions in the period in which such determination is made.

**(v) Leases**

The Confederation assess at lease commencement by applying significant judgment whether it is reasonably certain to exercise the extension option. The Confederation considers all facts and circumstances including their past practice and any cost that will be incurred to change the asset if an option to extend is not taken, to help them determine the lease term.

The Confederation also applied judgement and assumptions in determining the incremental borrowing rate of the respective leases. The Confederation first determine the closet available borrowing rates using significant judgement to determine the adjustments required to reflect the term, security, value or economic environment of the respective leases.

**13. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS**

The Confederation’s financial risk management policy seeks to ensure that adequate financial resources are available for the development of the Confederation’s whilst managing its financial risk including liquidity and cash flow risk. The Confederation operates within guidelines that are approved by the Boards and the Confederation’s policy is not to engage in speculative transactions.

The main areas of financial risks faced by the Confederation and the policy in respect of the major areas of treasury activity are set out as follows: -

**(a) Liquidity and cash flow risk**

The Confederation maintains a certain level of cash and cash convertible investments to meet its working capital requirements.

**(b) Foreign exchange risk**

The Confederation is exposed to foreign current risk as a result of its normal operation activities when the currency domination differs from its functional currency.

The Confederation maintains a natural hedge, wherever possible, by depositing foreign currency proceeds from receipt into foreign currency bank account which will preliminary be used for payments in the same domination. Foreign exchange exposures in transactional currencies other than functional currency of the operating entities are kept to an acceptable level.

**(c) Credit risk**

Cash deposits and other receivables may give rise to credit risk which requires the loss to be recognised if a counterparty defaults on its obligations. The Confederation’s exposure to credit risk arises primarily from other receivables. For other financial assets (including cash and bank balances), the Confederation minimises credit risk by dealing exclusively with high credit rating counterparties.

The credit risk with respect to other receivables are managed through the application of credit approvals, credit limits and monitoring procedures. Credit is extended to the customers based upon careful evaluation of the customer’s financial condition and credit history.

The Confederation’s normal credit term granted to members ranges from 30 to 60 days. Any other credit terms are assessed and approved on a case-by-case basis depending on the length of trading relationship, the volume of trade and other management considerations.

**(d) Fair values**

The carrying amounts of cash and cash equivalents and other receivables and other payables approximate fair value due to the relatively short to USD nature of these financial instruments.

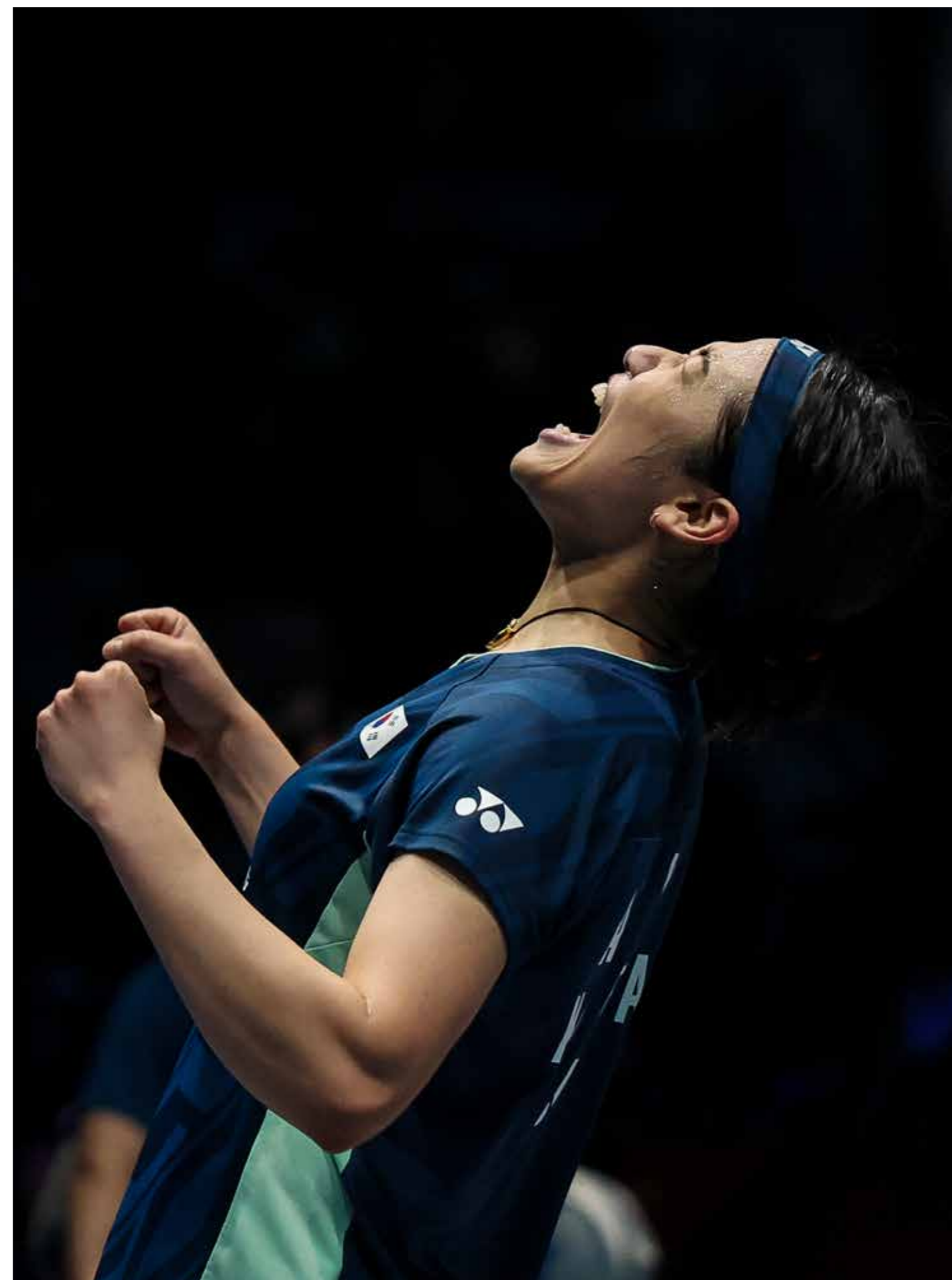

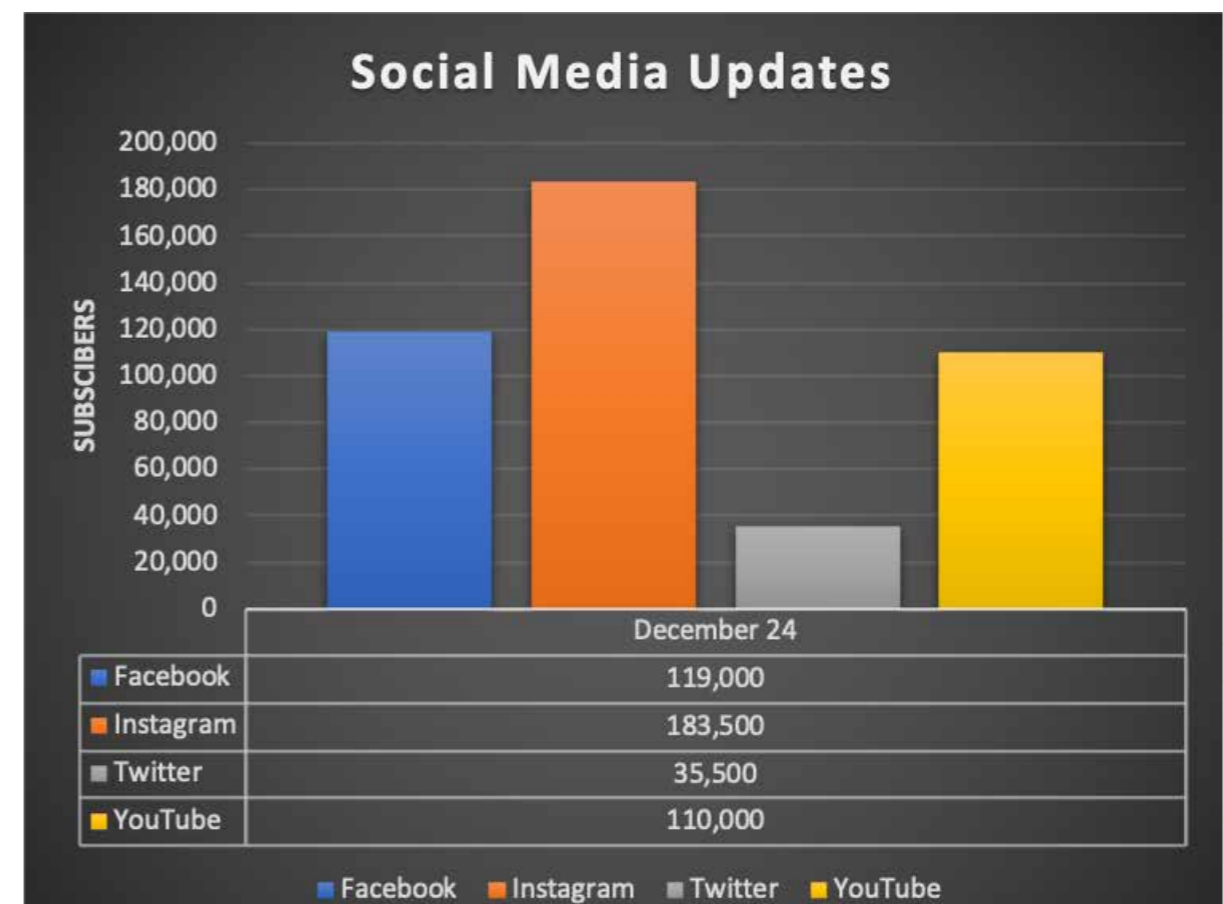
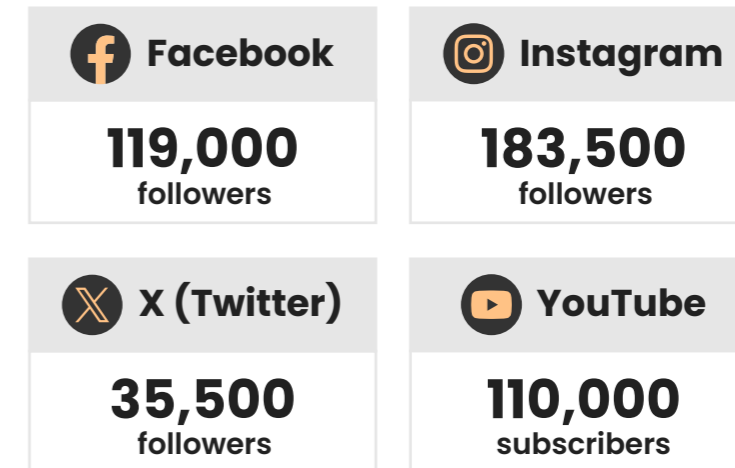

#### Selection Criteria:

- Open to all members of Badminton Asia (in good standing).
- Points are accumulated based on medals won. (Refer to the Point System Evaluation Form below):
  - Bronze = 1 point
  - Silver = 3 points
  - Gold = 6 points
- Each victory in doubles pairs and team events will be counted as individual medal points.
- In the event of a tie in points, both tied associations will be awarded the Performance Award.
- The final selection will be made by the Expert Panel based on official tournament results and data provided by the Events Team.

## BADMINTON ASIA TECHNICAL OFFICIAL EXCELLENCE AWARD

This award will be presented to the MA that has developed the highest number of technical officials through programs such as **BA Accredited**, **BA Certificated**, and **BWF Level**, during the selected evaluation period.

### Selection Criteria:

- Open to all members of Badminton Asia (in good standing).
- Member Associations are invited to submit their application based on the number of successful candidates (male and female) for BA Accredited, BA Certificated, and BWF Level during the selected evaluation period.
- Every candidate is required to submit the highest level of achievement.
- The final result will be selected by the Expert Panel of Badminton Asia based on internal records.
- Badminton Asia reserves the right to make the final decision.
- An application form will be provided by Badminton Asia.

## BADMINTON ASIA DEVELOPING AWARD

This award honours **Developing Member Associations** that have invested significant resources and effort to produce players who qualify for the **selected event(s) (to be determined later)**.

### Selection Criteria:

- This award recognizes the remarkable perseverance and dedication of the MA that has resulted in successfully qualifying players for the selected event(s).
- The Member Association must have at least one player selected to represent their Association at the selected event (s).
- This achievement highlights the MAs commitment to player development and international competition.

## BADMINTON ASIA HUMANITARIAN RECOGNITION AWARD

This award will recognize MA that have implemented **humanitarian efforts** benefiting communities.

### Selection Criteria:

- MAs must provide a concise description of their humanitarian program, supported by photos or videos.
- The awardee must demonstrate public-spiritedness, compassion, and leadership in supporting communities through humanitarian work.
- Contributions to areas such as emergency response, disaster relief, community engagement, or development work under challenging circumstances will be considered.

## COMMITTEE SCOPE OF WORK

The Rules and Laws Committee is responsible for ensuring that Badminton Asia operates in accordance with sound legal principles and good governance practices. The key focus areas of the Committee are:

- Reviewing proposed amendments by the Badminton World Federation (BWF) and the previous Committee to align with Badminton Asia’s core values and governance framework.
- Advising the Executive Committee (EXCO) on proposed amendments, particularly on their implications for Badminton Asia’s interests.
- Reviewing and drafting legal documents, including contracts, agreements, and constitutional amendments, to ensure legal clarity and compliance with best practices.
- Advising the EXCO on all existing contracts, including rights to renew, terminate, and pursue legal action against defaulting parties.
- Providing legal support in negotiating and finalising agreements related to sponsorship, media rights, hosting, and other key partnerships.



## HIGHLIGHTS

### Review and Finalisation of Badminton Asia’s New Constitution

The Rules and Laws Committee has successfully completed the review of the new proposed Constitution, which was initiated by the Badminton World Federation (BWF) in 2018. The Committee engaged in multiple discussions, both in person at the Badminton Asia office and virtually, to deliberate on the proposed amendments. During this AGM, we will present the new proposed Constitution, which reflects approximately **90% changes** to align with BWF’s initiative to standardise governance structures across all Continental Confederations.

Key aspects of this constitutional review include:

- **Harmonisation of judicial documents** to ensure consistency in language, definitions, and governance processes across all Continental Confederations in accordance with BWF while maintaining Badminton Asia’s core values and operational needs.
- **Standardisation of governance rules and processes** to align with BWF’s framework while ensuring they are practical and beneficial for Badminton Asia’s structure.
- **Comprehensive clause-by-clause analysis of all the proposed constitutional amendments by BWF** to assess their clarity, applicability, and impact on Badminton Asia, ensuring that the final constitution is well-suited to Badminton Asia’s governance and operational framework.

These amendments serve to enhance governance consistency, strengthen organisational structures, and ensure that Badminton Asia remains aligned with global best practices under the BWF framework, while also addressing BA’s specific needs and operational realities.

### Legal Proceedings Against Sunlight Sports Pte Ltd

The Committee continues to oversee the legal proceedings concerning **Sunlight Sports Pte Ltd** in relation to outstanding funds owed to Badminton Asia under the Sponsorship Agreement. **Richard Wee Chambers (RWC)** has been engaged to represent Badminton Asia in trial and mediation proceedings.

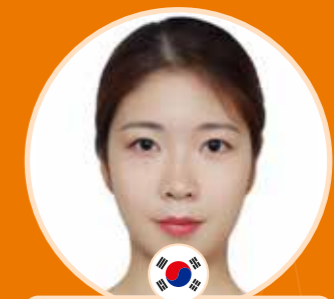

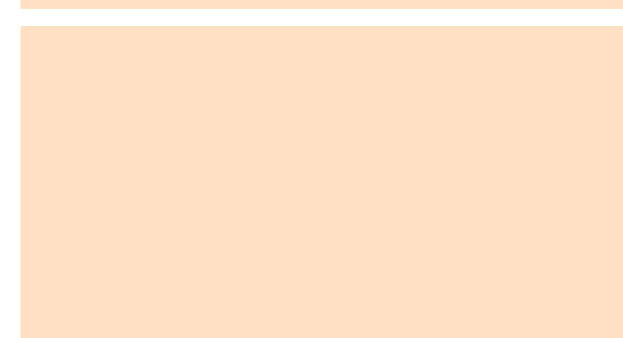

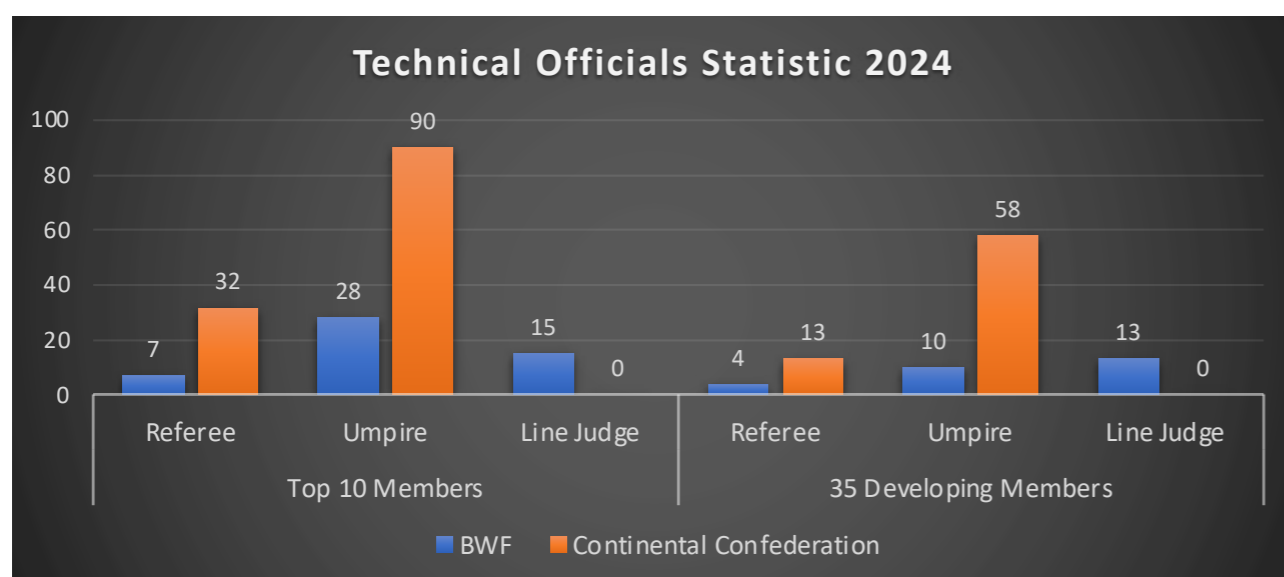

## HUMANITARIAN AID TO LEBANON: SUPPORT PROGRAMS AND EQUIPMENT FOR DISPLACED CHILDREN

In October 2024, the humanitarian initiative from the Lebanon Badminton Federation, supported by Badminton Asia, to benefit displaced children in Beirut, Lebanon. The initiative focuses on providing essential sports equipment and footwear to support the physical well-being and recreation of children across various shelters.



## PROGRAMMES AND SUPPORT EQUIPMENT

### 1 Sports Equipment for Recreational Activities

- 10 kits of essential sports equipment for children’s recreational activities. Each kit will include basketballs, footballs, volleyballs, badminton racquets, and training materials such as cones, agility hoops, and jump ropes.
- These kits will be used in shelters and schools, facilitating the Sports for Development initiative, implemented in collaboration with the Hoops Club and the local badminton federation.

### 2 1.000 pairs of Sports Shoes for Displaced Children

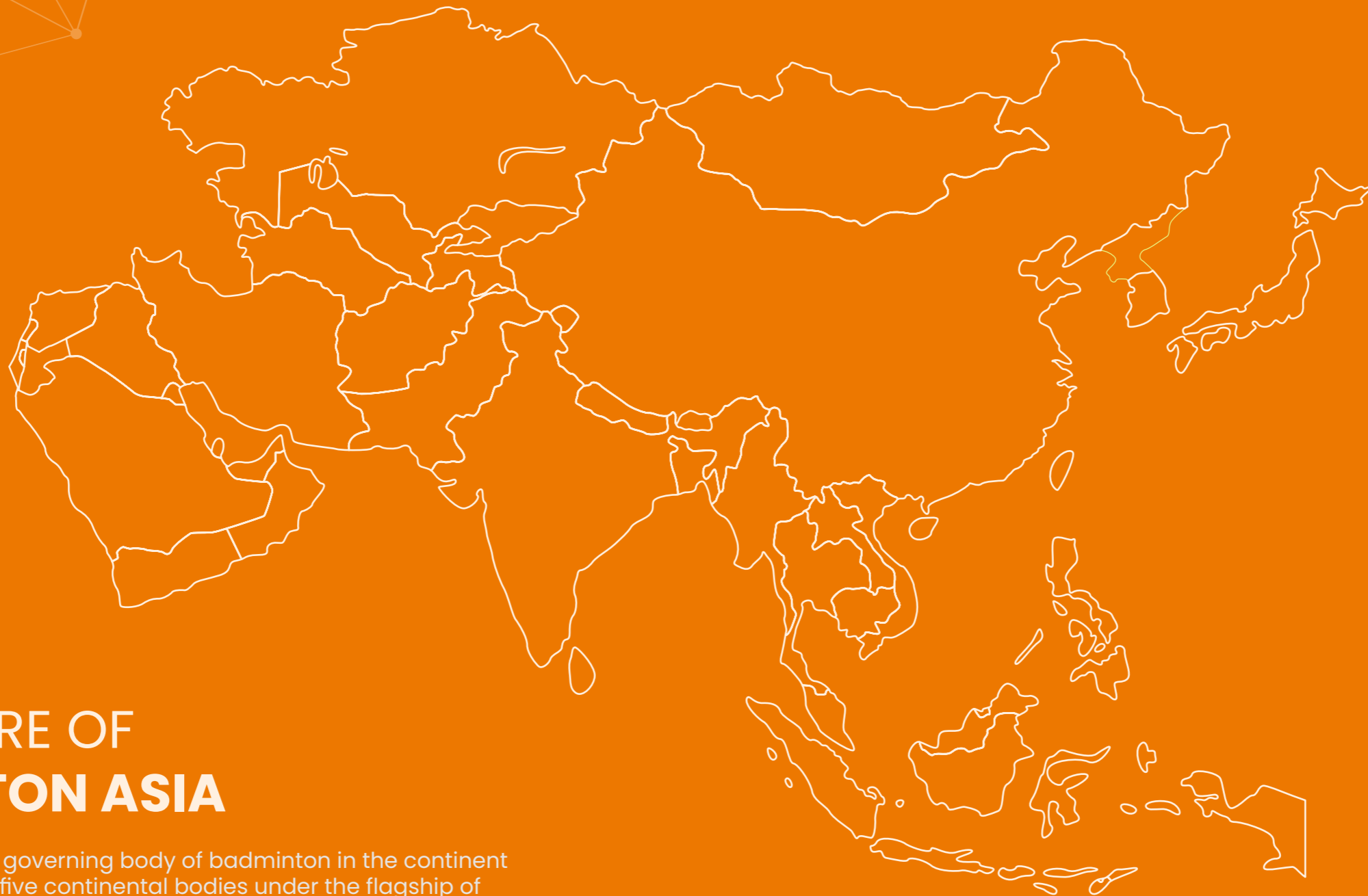
- Purchase of 1000 pairs of sports shoes for children and teenagers in shelters, ensuring the safe participation of children in sports and physical activities.
- Distribution to shelters across Beirut, critical for the upcoming winter season to prevent children from being barefoot.

### 3 Social Media Coverage and Visibility

- Promotion of the project through targeted social media campaigns to raise awareness.
- Branding materials such as banners and roll-ups for visibility.

### 4 Project Management, HR, and Administrative Support

- Allocation for managing the project, overseeing financials, coordinating the distribution of shoes and kits, and ensuring compliance with reporting and outreach efforts.
